In 2023, we are excited to announce the launch of Teen Debit Card Accounts for youth 14-18 offering alerts, digital wallets, direct deposit and more!

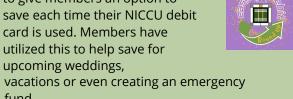
